When enrolling in a college course during high school you may elect to receive credit in one of two manners

- A. Your class may count as college credit only
- B. Your class may count as high school and college credit

The transferability of these credits is largely dependent on the institution you are planning to transfer credit to. It is the student and parent's responsibility to check with the college of your choice to make sure the classes you are taking will transfer to your chosen university. We have listed some things to consider in this decision on the back of this page. If you are unsure of the university you will attend we recommend you chose to receive credit for both high school and college. Below please list each course you wish to enroll in and chose which type of credit you would like to receive for each. Please note that with either option you are responsible for any costs associated with a course you do not earn a "C" or better in. Students also must meet MMCC's prerequisites to enroll some courses.
